

HOW TO

This Wiki is organised as follows:

From here you can either enter the "Technology and Terminology Wiki" or the "Component Documentation Wiki" by clicking on the highlighted text.

You choose the "**Technology and Terminology Wiki**" when you are interested in our common understanding of the terms (users, roles, models, etc.) used during the project.
